## CRIMINAL NATION

**For many of our fellow Americans, crime is their everyday survival challenge and as conditions deteriorate criminals will dominate more and more communities**

Einstein stated that "Doing the same thing over and over and expecting a different result is the definition of insanity", yet American cities continue to apply the same "politically acceptable" methods to curb crime and violence. They attempt to address individual crimes one at a time, when they are facing a criminalized society. **Criminality is as entrenched in urban society as the Taliban is in Afghanistan, and achieving true safety and freedom for residents of all races is as impossible as it is for the people of Afghanistan.** Criminals occupy the territory and are the true law. They have established an inverted morality where good is bad and bad is good. Where one's crimes are his or her honor. Where having a job, respecting others, and good citizenship are negative attributes and signs of weakness. In this society prison holds no shame or inconvenience, laws are meaningless, and the life and property of working citizens are as wool from sheep. In these communities virtually everyone has relatives, or friends

involved in crime and gangs. Criminality is woven into the life and economy of the community to the extent that to resist it or even express dissent can result in being isolated or worse. Buying stolen goods, or shoplifting are just normal ways to get things in this culture. This is why there are marches "against violence" or "against guns" but never against gangs or drugs. Those few who have stood up against gangs have been killed or had family members killed. **Gangs and drug cartels have political and economic muscle that aldermen and mayors cannot ignore.** While massive marches against the police are common, no one marches on the gang hangouts, or the embassies of Mexico or China where the drugs that fuel the gang violence and kill children come from. **While gun ownership is a responsibility and a shield for safety and liberty for responsible Americans, they are a tool of vengeance and intimidation for minions of the criminal nation.** The sad fact is that the violence will never end, because the sources are imbedded in the communities. A tragic example of how this criminal culture affects the community occurred in Chicago this August, when two police officers were shot (one died) with a Glock model 44 purchased

legally by a 22 year-old college graduate and school teacher who had no criminal record, but was convinced or coerced by his convicted felon “friends” to purchase the gun for them. In his society it would have been difficult or even dangerous to deny the request of these tattoo-necked gang-bangers. Now he faces serious jail time and a police officer is dead.

Implementation of a true “war on crime” would require war-like actions that no urban politician would dare implement. Here are a few actions that could turn the tide.

1. Return to the “stop or I’ll shoot” protocol for fleeing felons. The fact is that a police officer has the right (and obligation) to prevent a criminal from fleeing and is not obligated to tackle or struggle with them. One warning of “stop or I’ll shoot” is all that is required, and shooting them in the back is justified if they pose any danger to society. Unfortunately at this time: criminals can just run away and police are hesitant to use deadly force to stop them.
2. Stop and frisk should be justified whenever there is the appearance that a person may be carrying an illegal firearm or other contraband. If you are over eighteen, and have a valid concealed carry card you should be able to show that. But if you are a convicted felon or under eighteen, you can and should be disarmed and charged.
3. Straw purchasers of who buy guns and then knowingly transfer them to criminals, and those who steal guns and sell them to criminals must be aggressively tracked and prosecuted.
4. While the proses for approving raids and serving warrants should be carefully reviewed to prevent wrongful and illegal actions and assure that the felons and/or contraband are actually on site, no-knock warrants must remain a tool for law enforcement in order to safely make arrests and recover illegal drugs and weapons. Criminals cannot have safe havens.
5. Evict criminals from town. Some towns are enacting municipal codes that require landlord to evict people who are the cause of repeated police complaints. Most criminals rent, and when they are the cause of multiple police responses for drugs, fights, noise, and other disruptive behavior the location can be declared to be a “public nuisance”. These measures have been effective in crime reduction. A Police Chief was asked if this might seem racist, or if “innocent” relatives” might also be evicted. His response was “that’s not my problem, public safety is my job”.
6. The “stand your ground” and “castle” laws that establish the citizen’s right to use deadly force in self-defense on the street or at home should be strongly supported by the courts.
7. Shoplifters should get serious jail time after three-strikes. Currently, shoplifters are simply let go. In San Francisco shoplifting under \$900.00 is never prosecuted. Shoplifting drives business and jobs from minority communities.
8. It should be legal for business owners or hired guards to shoot looters once they enter the store. The same should apply to arsonists and vandals.
9. Protest groups should be held accountable for the actions of participants, and required to pay for security and crime prevention along the route.
10. Mothers and fathers of children under the age of eighteen should have some legal accountability for the criminal actions of their offspring.
11. China and Mexico should be held accountable and sanctioned for supplying the drugs that support the gangs and kill

thousands of American children and adults every year.

12. Active support for citizen's defense training, and anti-gang, anti-drug, and anti-crime programs including DARE\* and VIPS\* should be encouraged
13. Put criminals in jail. So called I-bond, and electronic monitoring along with other approaches to crime control have not worked. Yes, filling the prisons is expensive and the optics of racism is unfortunate, but the primary justification of government is to protect the lives and property of law-abiding, and productive citizens of all races from criminals, whatever it takes.
14. The death penalty should be reinstated nationally. This is a key tool for law enforcement to get convicted murderers to provide evidence of other crimes. It's not about revenge it's about leverage.
15. A vigorous anti-gang and anti-drug media campaign should be sustained to take the glory and prestige away from the criminal society, and to praise and reward responsibility and good citizenship. Gang members should be portrayed as fools and outcasts.

**Anything less than total war on the criminal nation within our American nation is doomed to fail.** I realize that the implementation of these steps might be interpreted as racist by those who benefit politically or economically from continued violence, but it is precisely these minority communities that are the victims of this criminal nation. Only these war-like measures, implemented by well-trained and funded police departments can stem the march towards urban anarchy in America.

*Interestingly: I tried to access some online photos of criminal gangs, and all I got was photos of police in riot gear, and police raids.*

*No photos of carjacking's, drug sales, or drive by shooting. This demonstrates the depth of the systemic-denial by the media that guarantees the continuation of the problem.*

*\* DARE is a strong school based program to keep kids away from drugs, and VIPS (Volunteers in Police Service) is a program that uses unarmed citizen volunteers to carry out non-violent police work such as traffic control, escorts, and wellness checks, releasing police for more critical tasks. They also provide more eyes and ears on patrol. These programs are always associated with communities that have low crime rates.*

## **Separating Politics from Survival Wisdom**

I must admit that all of the confusion about pandemic survival seemed quite odd to me. I had a pandemic plan, based on survival knowledge and it worked.

The first of my Ten Principles of Survival is "Anticipate". Based on the population density, travel rate and frequent "near miss" epidemics (e.g. swine flu, bird flu, Ebola) the potential for a major pandemic was almost 100 percent. In fact it was (and still is) the most probable mass-disaster predicted by scientists. In anticipation of such an event, I included respiratory protection and sanitation items as a high priority.

The second of my Ten Principles is "Be Aware". I was aware of the potential of a pandemic and was aware of the necessary precautions and preparations. I had established a number of "trigger" indicators of when to start implementing my plan. Being aware means having multiple sources of incoming information from reliable (not the internet, or politicians) sources. I subscribe to the Epoch Times, paper put out by anti-communist Chinese Americans. They started

publishing stories about mass quarantines, and people being dragged from their homes by hazmat suited troops, back in late November of 2019. That and a few other indicators were enough for me to start wearing an N95 respirator on some occasions. By January my wife and I were wearing N95s frequently, even as politicians were still down-playing the potential for a pandemic. My survival knowledge and my plan had nothing to do with the CDC or any politician or internet pontificator. Apparently, most of the population, including many preppers had not given serious consideration to the potential of a pandemic and were then left to act or react to the government and the media. In other words: they failed to: "Anticipate" and were not "Aware" of what to do or not do.

The lesson here should be simple: A true survivalist or prepper should:

- Anticipate realistic survival and emergency situations based on scientific and mathematical probabilities, not sensational Armageddon catastrophes. You can't shoot a virus, and the evacuation pack was of no value for this particular scenario. This was a "midrange" disaster that required moderate precautions and actions.
- Be aware of developing threats that may seem far way or not seem too serious. It's a small world, and things happen fast.
- Survival knowledge is essential to making good survival decisions. As an EMT and a certified respiratory protection trainer, I knew that N95 respirators work if properly fitted, so I had a stock of them years before the pandemic. I also understood that a virus with an R-naught rating of 4 is far more contagious than the flue

- Avoid hearing only what you want to hear. Politicians always tell the public what the public wants to hear. In this case, early misinformation created confusion as the pandemic worsened and strong precautions were advisable. Again: if you have knowledge and a plan you could just ignore them, and follow your plan.
- Be flexible and logical enough to change in the face of new conditions. Those who initially dismissed the seriousness of the pandemic and its effects still hung on to their positions long after the death rates had proven them wrong. History is paved with the bones of those who refused to adapt.
- Don't let ego, or emotions affect your survival decisions. "I'm tough", "I'm not afraid" or "no one can tell me what to do" is not survival thinking. In his book *Deep Survival\**, by Lawrence Gonzales relates how an Army Green Beret died on a tourist rafting trip with his family because he was tough and did not need to follow directions from a tour guide.

#### **Myths and errors:**

- **Masks don't work.** The efficacy of masks and more specifically N95 respirators is well established by OSHA, NIOSH, and the medical profession. Proof of the effectiveness of respirators and masks, is the fact that cases of the flue were almost non-existent in 2020. The flue which infect millions and kills thousand most years is far less contagious than Covid-19, so the masking precautions stopped it cold in 2020. Note: while I agree that respirators, hygiene and social distancing are effective tool in controlling a pandemic, I do not recognize the state or federal right to "mandate" doing so. What the state or the media says should be irrelevant if you know what will work

- **You can still catch Covid-19 through your eyes.** Technically true, but, the infected person has to cough, spit or breathe into your face. The surface area of the eyes is a few square inches, whereas the surface area of the lungs is about that of a football field. Contaminated air passing over that much surface is sure to infect.
- **The statistics were inflated.** If they were, so maybe it killed only 500,000 instead of over 600,000 Americans, seriously? Actually: many fatalities in late 2019 and early 2020 were probably not recognized as Covid-19 related. As a police volunteer I did 2-3 times as many funeral escorts in 2020 than in previous years.
- **Vaccines don't work or are dangerous.** When I was a child Polio was rampant killing and crippling thousand each year, now it's gone. Measles, smallpox, chickenpox, mumps all gone! In fact the over-population issue is a direct result of effective vaccines preventing epidemics from regulating the population. It is not unusual to have a mild reaction to vaccinations, in fact this is just your immune system ramping up for prevention.
- **Covid-19 only kills old or sick people.** So that's okay!? Yes it did kill the elderly and those with preexisting conditions more often, but it killed thousands of young and apparently healthy as well. In one case a healthy 19 year-old girl died in three days.
- **It only kills a small percent of those who catch it.** Yes, the percentage is low, but 700,000 (and counting) people is a *lot* of deaths. While some only had mild symptoms, a lot of others were very, very sick. Those who had it (even mild cases) are now experiencing a host of after effects that involve the brain, heart, lungs,

thyroid, and other organs. Most of this could have been avoided.

Those who fail to learn from history are doomed to repeat it, or in this case just doomed. What worked and what didn't work must be part of post disaster evaluation. Gather knowledge. Make intelligent plans. Stay informed. Anticipate that another disaster (possibly another pandemic) is inevitable. Instead of needing to depend on the government, the internet, or the media to tell you what to do, you will already know. **Neither compliance nor defiance should be part of intelligent self-reliance.**

## Personal Hazard Analysis

As a professional Safety Manager for over 40 years, I had extensive training in Hazard Analysis, and Near Miss Investigation. In my early career "safety" was about investigating injuries and blaming someone. Preventive action was focused on just the specific cause of just the specific accident, not the broader underlying issues of management policies and employee behavior. Corrective action was limited to installing guards, or disciplinary action. Later we developed methodologies for identifying hazards before they resulted in injury, and aggressively reacting to "near miss" incidents as opportunities to prevent injuries and even catastrophic industrial spills, fires, and explosions. I participated in dozens of exhaustive "what if" analysis programs with teams from DuPont, Sherwin-Williams, and OSHA looking for potential safety problems. While mothers tell their children "don't go

looking for trouble”, that was my job. My professional training and experiences provided me with unique tools for application to survival and emergency preparedness situations.

While the common concept of a survival scenario envisions a natural or manmade Armageddon, with cities in flames, and massive evacuations and battles, many hazards far more subtle and insidious, but just as deadly. **Survivalist often make the mistake of focusing on the spectacular, media promoted (nuclear war, meteor, EMP) scenarios, while being less prepared for more local, personal, or slow developing hazards to their lives and freedoms.** The recent Covid19 pandemic is a prime example of this failure. Hazard Analysis placed the probability of a large-scale pandemic far ahead of any war, revolution, or EMP) yet most “preppers” focused on evacuation packs and weapons ahead of sanitation and respiratory protection. The “Near Miss” incidents of SARS, Swine-Flu, and Bird Flu should have put everyone on alert to prepare for an epidemic, but these warnings were largely ignored. **Survival preparations and plans must be based on logical analysis personal, regional, and global hazards, and on-going trends and observed or experienced near-miss incidents.**

### Prioritizing Hazards

Anticipated survival hazards and your preparations to cope with them must be prioritized by combining the probability and potential impact of the event.

### Probability Rating

	Probability	Example
1	Highly Unlikely	Meteor Impact, Zombie Apocalypse

2	Somewhat Unlikely	Electromagnetic Pulse, Nuclear War
3	Possible	Nuclear Accident, Civil War, Famine
4	Probable	Pandemic, Terrorist Attack, Economic Collapse
5	Assured	Civil Unrest, Natural Disasters, Crime,

Probability also has to be graded in terms of time. For example: the probability of a catastrophic meteor strike in the next ten years is infinitesimally low, but inevitable over centuries, while the chances of another pandemic, economic collapse or civil war may be ten percent within the next year, and up to fifty percent within ten years.

### Severity Rating

	Severity	Example
1	Inconvenient	Recession, shortages,
2	Difficult	Low Grade Pandemic (Covid19), Economic Collapse,
3	Destructive, Injurious	Fires, Storms, Floods, Accidents, Cyber Attack
4	Potentially Fatal	Civil Unrest, Famine, Terrorist Attack
5	Massive Death and Destruction	High Grade Pandemic, Nuclear War, Civil War, Meteor Strike.

Actual severity depends on how the event will affect you and your family. If you live in a rural area civil unrest may have less impact on you, but natural disasters may be more of a concern.

Grading a hazard and the priority for preparedness involves adding the probability

factor to the severity factor, and then making some subjective adjustments. For example:

The probability of nuclear war is only 2, but the potential severity is 5, so you have a preparedness priority of 6 or 7.

The probability of another pandemic is 5, and the severity may range from 2 to 3, giving a preparedness priority of 7 or 8.

Generally: anything with a rating of 6 or above should be given a high priority

While some survival issues such as storms, civil unrest, and fires are classified as “acute” because their effects are immediate and severe, other slow developing challenges such as economic decline, pandemics, climate change, and political instability are “chronic”, developing over months or years.

### Potential Survival Threats

Obviously survival is about what happens to *you*, and those *you* care about. If you are able to survive, then you can help your neighbors, your community and your nation, but first you have to stay alive, healthy and free. **Hazards and threats can come from your own action, or from actions and events in your surrounding environment at several levels.**

### Survival is Personal

We often become focused on “external threats” such as crime, unrest, wars, and natural disasters, while ignoring the threats we create for ourselves. **If you die because of your own negligence or bad habits you are just as dead as if you have died in Armageddon.** These personal survival threats must be included in your hazard analysis, as they are the most probable cause of illness and death, and ones that you can reduce or eliminate.

- **Health:** maintain your health is the foundation of survival preparedness. Healthy eating habits, regular exercise, regular medical checkups, and dental care will give you a big advantage during a survival emergency of any kind.
- **Home Safety:** doing a home safety inspection, home maintenance, and having fire extinguishers, and first aid kits are essential survival precautions. Your home is your survival base. If you are injured because of a tripping hazard or your home catches fire that’s a disaster for you.
- **Habits:** Obviously smoking, excessive drinking, drug use, and a poor choice of associations is going to shorten your life and create unnecessary survival challenges.

### Home & Family

Your home and family must be part of your survival planning and preparations. **Every member of the family should have their own survival pack, and know what to do in various situations.** Dysfunctional family members can endanger everyone. You must manage these risks, Unsafe or openly resistant family members may have to be isolated or excluded from survival plans. Obviously survival tools such as firearms, knives, etc., must be kept out of reach of children and irresponsible adults. A safe well-prepared family can go a long-way towards reducing the severity of most hazards.

### Regional/Community

Both the severity and the probability of some hazards is dependent on the location and type of community in which you reside. In urban areas, crime, civil unrest, and terrorist attacks are more likely. Those who live in suburban or rural areas are more vulnerable to forest fires and tornadoes. The danger of earthquakes,

chemical spills, and floods depends on your specific location. Moving usually only exchanges one set of hazards for another. Family and job responsibilities may dictate your location. **You can make your job and your community safer by getting involved in job safety programs, community emergency preparedness organizations, and crime prevention initiatives.** These actions can reduce the probability and severity of some threats.

### **National/International**

The Covid-19 pandemic demonstrated how events in far-way places can create survival challenges in our homes and communities. These threats include wars, pandemics, economic collapse, cyber-attacks, climate change, and political instability. **While we have little control of these events, we can be constantly vigilant and aware of national and world affairs, and be prepared for their effect on our own survival and freedom.** Tyranny is spreading, famines and shortages are growing, the world is becoming less and less safe, less and less free, and people are becoming more and more desperate.

### **Conclusion**

Intelligent hazard analysis on a personal, family, regional and global level will help identify immediate and future threats to life and freedom. Preparedness to prevent, avoid or survive specific threats combined with general self-reliance development is essential to the preservation of responsible individuals and families through this century and beyond. A few things to keep in mind are:

- The past is not always indicative of the future.
- Because it has not happened before, does not imply that it cannot happen.

- Because it has happened, in no way reduces the chances of it happening again.
- Because it has not yet happened to you, in no way reduces the chances of it happening to you in the future.

## **Turn off the Gas!**

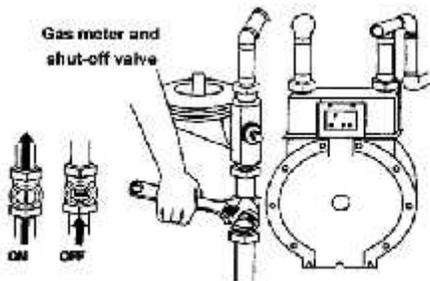

Hurricane Ida caused massive damage from flooding, but overhead videos from Louisiana to New Jersey showed multiple fires and explosions throughout flooded communities. In 2004 I got a crash-course in what a flood can do when my town experienced a major flood. The local river broke through and over-topped the existing levees. While the water stopped just yards from my home, I was involved in the cleanup and security measures that followed. Even though this flood was not on a scale of Ida in terms of area, it had the same damaging affects to my neighbors' homes. Most of the residents abandoned their home, thinking that damage would be limited, but thousands of homes were flooded up to the middle of the first floor. Even where the water only filled the basement, the damage to the foundations often resulted in complete loss of the structure. Basement walls are not designed to withstand the water pressure of a true flood. There were several fires and one house explosion due to gas and electricity being left on. When evacuating a home because of flooding, earthquake, or other structure damaging events, the homeowner should always turn off the gas and electrical supply to prevent fires and explosions. Structural and underground damage to gas pipes can cause leakage into the home.

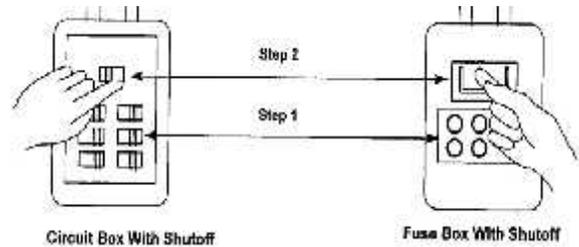


All that's left of a house that blew up because the gas was left on when the owner evacuated. The gas dryer floated up and broke its line filling the house with gas. The security light timer turned on the lights at exactly 7:00 PM and BOOM! The explosion totaled three other homes and damaged many more.

Flooding will float stoves, water heaters, gas dryers, and other appliances causing the connecting lines to snap. Gas will fill the structure and wait for a spark to cause a fire or explosion. That will not only obliterate the home, but damage and destroy homes in the surrounding area. Fire departments will usually be unable to reach the fire during a flood so the fire will spread to other structures and burn to the waterline. Every homeowner should know how to turn off the gas and electric supply as shown below.



Proper way to turn off the gas supply. Once this is done you should contact the gas company to have them turn it back on safely. It is highly recommended that you keep a wrench right at your gas meter for fast access.



Proper method for turning off the electricity. First shutoff individual breakers or pull individual fuses, then shut off main breaker or pull main fuse. Do not attempt this if your basement is already flooded.

In addition to the election, a number of proposed amendment and resolutions previously planned for 2020 and 2021 will be introduced. This will also be the final planning or Camp Independence and other programs going forward in 2022 and beyond.

## Nomination Form

While some of the previous officers may run for reelection, many of the offices are open as of this date, and some were never filled before the pandemic. The future of the organization depends on having a full slate of active candidates. Members can request nomination for themselves or others, and can nominate for more than one office, but can only be elected to one.
